1. WSC Dinghy Racing Key Characteristics

- Is Class Racing ... mainly
- In Club-Approved Classes:

Cadet, Dragonfly, Lark, ILCA (Laser), OK, RS200, Squib, Topper, Wayfarer

- On Saturday Afternoons March to November
- And on Wednesday Evenings April to September
- **Consistent Start Times** no variation for tides
- **High Quality Race Management** safety, equipment, courses, start lines, duration, results service
- Supported by Race Training coaching for sailors and race managers

2. Types of Racing

a) Class Series Racing

- Saturday Afternoons (Club Approved Class Starts only)
- Wednesday Evenings (ILCA (Laser), Dragonflies, Squibs only)

b) Handicap Series Racing

• Wednesday Evenings (Fast handicap inc. Lark, OK, RS200 & Wayfarer; Slow handicap inc. Cadet & Topper)

c) Trophy Races

- 7 in 2025 (Victory Plate/Jubilee Cup, Coronation Cup, Starling Cup/ Cork Plate, Navigation Race, Round the Island, EIIR Jubilee Trophy, Trafalgar Plate and Quantrill Trophy)
- Mostly Handicap or Pursuit races

d) Club Open Meetings

- 3 per year (Easter Egg, Regatta, Cartoon Trophy)
- All class racing

e) Class Open Meetings

• 4 in 2025 (Cadet Open, Cadet Week, Dragonfly Open, ILCA (Laser) Open)

f) Team Racing

- New in 2025
- on various Sundays using Fireflies

3. Safety Boats

- 4 Ribs rescue & recovery (+ escort for passing yachts)
- 3 Displacement
 - Boadicea the principal committee boat race management
 - Kirton Owl race management & mark laying
 - Fynn Lass (the blue boat) is often used as a finishing boat






4. Racing Areas

Saturday afternoon racing starts from a committee boat positioned in one of the yellow areas. Racing takes place within or between these areas.

Top Tip. Check the blackboard for the start area and launch in time, considering wind and tide, to arrive there for your start


Wednesday evening racing starts from the club line. Courses vary depending on wind strength, wind direction and tide. Race courses take sailors into and between the two closer yellow areas

Some Trophy Races go further e.g. Navigation Race upriver to Melton Bridge

6. Racing Starts

Saturday Afternoons

- 2 races
- Each race has 6 class starts
 - 1. RS200
 - 2. Cadet
 - 3. K Start (Dragonfly, Lark, OK, Topper)
 - 4. Wayfarer
 - 5. ILCA (Laser)
 - 6. Squib
- First start is RS200s at 1320
- Thereafter at 3-minute intervals (3, 1, Go)
- Second start is back-to-back or not before 1500
- Starts are 30 mins earlier from 1 November (2025)

Wednesday Evenings

- 1 race
- 5 starts
 - 1. ILCA (Laser)
 - 2. Dragonfly
 - 3. Fast Handicap (Lark, OK, RS200, Wayfarer*)
 - 4. Squib
 - 5. Slow Handicap (Cadet & Topper*)
- First start is ILCA (Laser) at 1854
- Thereafter at 3-minute intervals (3, 1, Go)
- * Other classes to check if they're Fast or Slow
- Starts are 30 mins earlier from 20 August (2025)

Details for **Open Meetings** are published on the WSC website well before each event via Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions. Details of **Trophy Races** are given in the club weekly email.





G. Club Line Starts and Finishes (every Wednesday, very occasional Saturdays)



denoted as a Club Bias Line or CBS







Some examples of course information displayed onshore on the club house blackboard







15. Other Matters

- a) Race **postponements**, signalled to sailors by the AP flag, are used to delay starts until wind conditions "settle"
- b) Racing can be **cancelled** if conditions are unlikely to be suitable every effort is made to cancel before sailors travel to the club when it is clear and obvious that no racing will be possible
- c) Start area **etiquette** all classes not in their 3 minute sequence should keep well clear of the starting area
- d) There is **Local Rule** any contact with a moored boat incurs a 360-degree penalty turn and must be reported (see pics below right)
- e) If you want to **learn quickly** how racing works at WSC then sign up for "Assistant Race Officer" duties
